



Duncan's talent in his own words

A LIFELONG Manchester United fan has re-published a book writ-ten by Dudley's very own Duncan Edwards.

Nick Sharples, from Manchester, first heard about Duncan's book 'Tackle Soccer This Way' a few years ago and after tracking down an original copy on eBay, found it was "a delight to read". The book was written by the

Busby Babe as a guide for young people wanting to learn how to play football, but also features a number of asides with stories about his own life and players at the time.

Tragically, Duncan never saw the book published. He died in the Munich air crash just days after

Duncan Edwards.

The book had three print runs in 1958. which all immediately sold out, but then no more were released.

Nick, aged 34, said: Whenever we watch Manchester United play, before the matches people always talk about who is the best foothaller - and everyone used to say noone was as good as

about proper sports-manship." He added: "It is really well written and the standard of English is quite high. It is like a historical document, but is still also a relevant instruction man-ual for budding young

footballers of today.
"I thought it was such a shame that this book is so hard to get hold of. Second hand copies are also expensive, they can go for anything between £70 and £200 now, so I decided to get it re-published myself."

"These days footballers get a lot rights to the book and hit brick walls as he found companies didn't exist anymore, or had merged

into other companies.

But after finally getting the goahead from the publishers, he had to work out who owned what copyright and contact them to ask per mission to re-use the work in the


latest edition. It took the dedicated Mancunian, just six months to get the book in print and get 250 copies published.

The book is almost exactly like the original, although the new version is in paperback, whereas the original was hardback

The front cover also had to be redesigned after the owner of the original picture couldn't be found.

Nick said: "Getting the book re-published was only a side line for me, it was just a hobby. I have never done anything like this before, but I think it is brilliant."
